## Why do you need so much space to teach one class? Wednesday, April 13 Noon - 1 p.m.

The law enforcement program at Hennepin Tech has very unique, very large training spaces. When we were first designing our new building all the people from MNSCU would say “why do you need so much room?!” To effectively train officers to work with people, in both routine and hostile situations, we need to put the students in as realistic a setting as possible. We can never teach reality but we want them to be in areas that would simulate real situations as closely as possible. In our training facility, we have a simulated city street, bar, small business, efficiency apartment and a one story home that includes a kitchen, bathroom, living room and bedrooms. We also built spaces that we could co-teach with fire and EMS. Learn how we use those spaces and our success in training law enforcement officers through the use of simulated scenarios.
