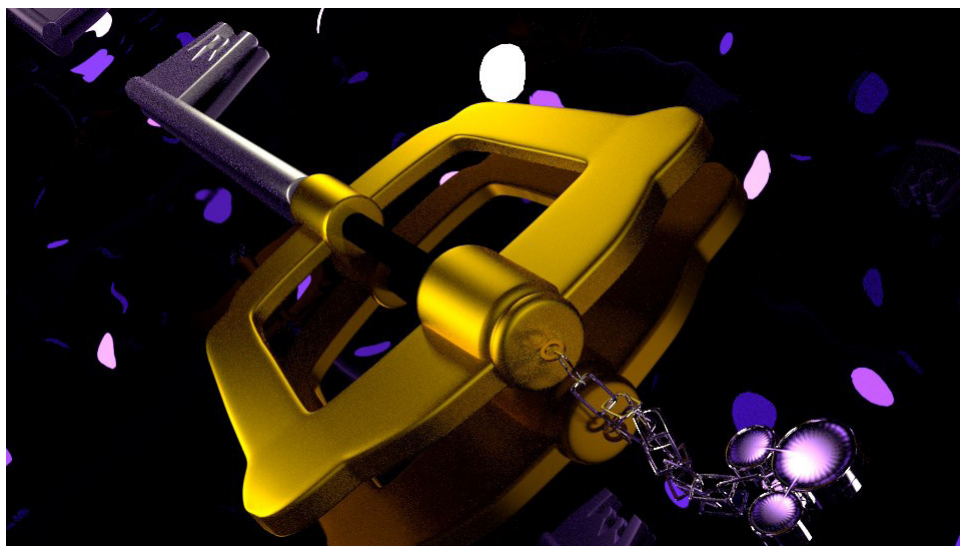


## **NEW: Animation & Interactive Media Degree at RCC**
