Email or Mail In Bid

Welcome to the 7th annual Mohawk Valley Regional 4-H Livestock Auction. Although the 2020 CNY Farm Progress Show is cancelled, we are still moving forward with the 4-H Livestock Auction, but in a bit different format. We are asking bidders to send bids to Jennifer Collins either via email (jlr34@cornell.edu) or postal mail (5657 State Route 5 Herkimer, NY 13350) received in office by **September 17**. Bids will be for price per pound of live animal. All information on animals being sold is on our website and final weights of animals will be taken on **September 12**. Bids will be opened on **September 19** and highest bidders will be notified. You can send a bid for a specific steer or a general bid for any steer.

All auction participants are 4-H members in either Herkimer or Oneida Counties. Youth are required to attend meetings and workshops throughout the year to learn about record keeping, marketing and livestock nutrition. We are very proud of our youth and their quality 4-H market projects. A very special thank you to our committee that have helped make this event possible: Audrey & Jeff Donahoe, Rick Donahoe, Casey Holbert, Sarah Hardy and Ashley & Adam McFarland.

Terms & Conditions: All auction purchases sell to the highest bidder. Due to the inability to “run” the animals through the ring a second time, we will be unable to have the animals donated back. If you wish to a donation to Herkimer County 4-H or a 4-H member, you can include that in your bid. Highest bidders will be notified and check can be made payable to CCE Herkimer and mailed to the 4-H Office (5657 State Route 5 Herkimer, NY 13350).

Processing: Arrangements have been made for the beef to be processed at either Empire Custom Processing (USDA Certified) in Bridgewater (Processing date of September 23) or Nolt’s Custom Meat Cutting in Lowville (Processing date of September 21). If you choose to use a different processor, those arrangements must be made on your own. All processing fees are the responsibility of the buyer.

Trucking: Trucking will be supplied to the following processing facilities. Pick up of processed meat is the responsibility of the buyer.

Special Note: The auction committee and Cornell Cooperative Extension do not take responsibility for any costs or issues incurred after the sale of an animal. All costs incurred after the sale of an animal are the responsibility of the buyer including, but not limited to processing fees.
