ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Elliott School's *Global Gender Policy Certificate* provides a specialty program that equips future international affairs professionals with the knowledge and skills required to advance gender equality across broad areas of policy and programming globally.

The *Global Gender Policy* curriculum includes classes that equip students with knowledge of the global policy architecture on gender equality; critical analytical skills on gender and processes of international development; practical understanding of how to address gender-based violence in humanitarian settings; knowledge and understanding of gender, conflict and preventing violent extremism; and professional skills in gender advising roles and women's rights advocacy.

REQUIREMENTS

The Global Gender Policy Certificate requires a *minimum of 15 credit hours*.

Students must complete one core course: **IAFF 6102 Global Gender Policy** (3 credits).

Students then choose from among the list of supporting classes listed below. Approval for additional classes available across George Washington University may be sought from the Director of the *Program on Gender Equality in International Affairs*.
