**Dr. Kevin Gray** is a lecturer in International Relations at the School of Global Studies, University of Sussex. He is the author of *Korean Workers and Neoliberal Globalisation* (Routledge, 2008), *Labour and Development in East Asia: Social Forces and Passive Revolution* (Routledge, 2015). He has co-edited volumes on (with Barry Gills) *People Power in an era of global crisis: rebellion, resistance and liberation* (2012); (with Craig Murphy) *Rising Powers and the Future of Global Governance* (2013); (with Barry Gills) *Rising Powers and South-South Cooperation* (2017). He has published widely on various aspects of East Asian political economy, and his work has appeared in *Review of International Political Economy*, *Journal of Contemporary Asia*, *New Left Review*, *Pacific Review*, *North Korean Review*, *Globalizations*, *New Political Economy*, and *Third World Quarterly*.
