This database provides access to archival and current issues of more than 2,000 scholarly journals across more than 50 academic disciplines. Some journals date back to the 1800s. Topics covered include: Anthropology, Asian Studies, Feminist & Women's studies, Population Studies, and Sociology.

### Factiva

Drawn from more than 35,000 sources, Factiva provides current news and analysis. It also offers same-day and archival coverage of The New York Times, The Straits Times, Wall Street Journal, Financial Times, Fortune, Time, Newsweek and local newspapers from every corner of the globe.



## THOMSON REUTERS

### Social Sciences Citation Index (via Web of Knowledge - Web of Science)

This citation database indexes over 2,474 of the world's leading social sciences journals across 50 disciplines, with backfiles to 1900. Topics covered include: Anthropology, Cultural Studies, Criminology & Penology, Demography, Ethnic Studies, Family Studies, Social Issues, Social Work, Sociology, Substance Abuse. Urban Studies and Women's Studies.



### Digital Dissertations & Theses

The Dissertation Abstracts database is the single, authoritative source of doctoral dissertations and master's theses from over 1,000 accredited North American graduate schools and European universities.
