





About the City of Seaside

The City of Seaside encompasses approximately 3.9 square miles of land and 0.2 square miles of surface water. As of the 2013 census, Seaside has a population of 6,453 citizens, with a population increase of 9.4% in the last ten years. Although Seaside's population appears to be relatively small, Seaside is a major resort destination on the Oregon Coast. Motels, tourist related retail, and general service activities make up the primary economic base for the community. The City has historically been one of the Oregon Coast's most visited and popular oceanfront communities seeing a tourist population increase to 40,000 from June-September.

In his second year with the RARE AmeriCorps Program, Jeremy Goldsmith will continue his work as Preparedness Outreach Coordinator for the City of Seaside. He will focus the majority his time working to strengthen local tsunami and earthquake preparedness activities via an array of education and outreach activities. Other projects include providing technical assistance, coordination and leadership, and act as a liaison between City staff and various stakeholders on development of a project implementation plan for Seaside's Necanicum Estuary Natural History Park and an update of the Seaside Parks System Master Plan.
