### **Assignment**

The RARE participant will assist in a community effort to develop a TMDL (Water Quality Plan) for the Umatilla River Basin, including pollution load allocations and water quality management plans. The participant will also research and write grants for projects identified in these plans. The participant will assist the Coordinator in public outreach activities, seasonal water quality sampling, data analysis, and compilation of data.

The Council has an aggressive education project that provides coordination to the Natural Resource Systems Consortium, which is made up of 25-30 school teachers and administrators from various school districts and is facilitated by the Umatilla-Morrow Education Services District. The participant will connect classroom teachers with natural resource professionals to create field-based learning opportunities for students; assist teachers in identifying and securing technical assistance and curriculum resources for classroom instruction; and assist the Umatilla-Morrow ESD staff to coordinate and manage the consortium and its activities, including the website and annual Watershed Field Day.
