Scholarly Output and Awards

N.B. In the relatively small field of Russian, East European, and Eurasian Studies and, in the even smaller subfield of Russian literary studies, any of the quantitative measures listed below (number of citations, number of library holdings worldwide, etc.) would need to be calibrated to account for the size of the field. Moreover, given the size of the field, and the fact that citations and holdings in non-U.S. venues may not be picked up by search engines, this data may not be accurate. For this reason, we have also included qualitative measures—measures that have historically been privileged in hiring, tenure, and promotion decisions in our field.

Conference Proceedings

Quality and **impact** varies according to venue insofar as these publications are generally not refereed; however, conference proceedings of prestigious global venues such as the International Congress of Slavists are generally well regarded.

Reference Articles

Quality and **impact** varies according to venues but can be measured by the following factors:

- reviews in scholarly venues
- number of libraries in which the encyclopedia or reference book is held worldwide

Venues range from respected university publishers like Oxford UP and Princeton UP to a wide range of respected commercial publishers (See above for examples)
