Alison Brysk is the Mellichamp Professor in the Global Studies Department at UC Santa Barbara. She holds a Ph.D. in Political Science from Stanford University, and specializes in human rights, global governance, social movements, and gender relations. She is the author or editor of ten books, including *The Politics of Human Rights in Argentina*, *From Tribal Village to Global Village*, *Human Rights and Private Wrongs*, *Global Good Samaritans*, and *Speaking Rights to Power*. Professor Brysk has been a scholar and lecturer in Argentina, Australia, Austria, Ecuador, France, Spain, Germany, Sweden, the Netherlands, South Africa, and Japan--and has held Fulbright Fellowships in India and Canada. In 2013-2014, Brysk was a Fellow at the Woodrow Wilson Center in Washington, D.C. and was awarded the 2015-2016 International Studies Association Distinguished Scholar in Human Rights.
