
What web browsers are supported for VeriCite?

Google Chrome and Mozilla Firefox are the recommended browsers. Note: VeriCite will not work in Safari.


VeriCite Submission Options

How do I submit a VeriCite assignment?

In Canvas, navigate to your assignment. The following page will open:




Students can submit their papers by dragging and dropping the files, or copy/pasting the text into VeriCite. Once you have uploaded your paper, there will be a review screen where you can confirm the 'Assignment' and 'Assignment Title' and review the text of your submission. Once you're ready, click "Submit Paper". (See the following screenshot for reference)



Is it possible to upload multiple papers at once?

Yes. VeriCite allows multiple documents to be uploaded at once through the use of zip files. All files must be added to a folder and compressed into a zip file before uploading. Once a zip folder has been accepted, VeriCite will prompt the user to review the file's title, user and assignment the submission is related to. After the review process is complete, click "Submit Papers" to complete the submission process. Students and instructor can upload zip folders.

Note: Unless a student needs to submit multiple documents for one assignment, it is unlikely that students will need to upload zip files. Usually students will only submit one document per assignment.




Can I submit draft versions of my paper?

Yes. Students may submit and re-submit versions of their paper to the same assignment. VeriCite won't flag multiple versions of a student's paper as being potentially plagiarized, so long as the student is submitting the newer versions of their paper to the same VeriCite assignment within Canvas. If a student were to submit their paper to a different assignment, it would then be flagged as potentially plagiarized.

Reviewing Submitted Papers

How do I review papers that I have submitted to VeriCite?

Once the paper has been submitted, students will be presented with a confirmation screen and the ability to “View Report”. VeriCite will generate the report and then load the VeriCite review screen. (See the following three screenshots for reference)



Is there another way to access my paper once I've submitted it to VeriCite?

Once an assignment has been completed, students can go back to the Assignments tool in Canvas and open up the assignment again. In the window that appears, student will have access to information about their submission, and be provided the opportunity to "View Report". Clicking "View Report" will open the same VeriCite review screen as previously mentions. (See the following screenshot for reference)



How do I search and sort through VeriCite reports?

VeriCite provides a "Highlight Legend" that shows a range of Low to High Matches. This legend corresponds to the highlighted text from the student paper. By clicking on a color within the legend, VeriCite will automatically move you through the documents showing the color priority that you've selected. (See the following screenshot for reference)

What are Top Matches and how do I review them in the VeriCite report?

The Top Matches tab is located next to the Details tab when viewing a VeriCite report. Clicking on the “Top Matches” tab displays a list of links to external websites, and to other papers found within the University of Oregon’s VeriCite submission database. Users can scroll through the student submission, or click on the colors in the Highlight Legend to view highlighted text. As a user scrolls through the document, the links under Top Matches will change to display the location where VeriCite has found a match to the text of a student’s submission. Users can click on the link under Top Matches to navigate away from VeriCite for review.

Note: the following message appears when VeriCite has previously indexed a website’s content, but that websites content is no longer available: “Problem retrieving matched paper. We found a match...” VeriCite does not remove these links from their database because it provides an indication that at one time content that was found in a student’s submissions was also found elsewhere online.

In this ever--changing world of rules and regulations, one is of particular importance for anyone undertaking an upgrade to an existing facility or building a new one. The Department of Justice, in 2010, revised regulations for Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act and on March 15, 2012 set into motion the compliance date for using the 2010 standards for new construction, alterations, program accessibility and barrier removal.

In the field of audio visual, accommodations must be made for the hearing impaired and the blind. Two systems currently in service are the assistive listening hearing system and the inductive loop system. Assistive listening hearing systems incorporate a transmitter and receiver (usually in the form of an FM receiver) that is worn on a belt or carried and tunes into a specific frequency. Inductive loop systems incorporate a loop (perimeter or multiphase) to keep reproduced audio within a contained space. These loops work with both inductive and "t--coil" hearing aids. Both of these systems now need to be designed to meet the needs of the

What is dynamic reporting in VeriCite?


This means new originality reports are generated every time an instructor or student decides to review a VeriCite report. This provides a fresh report that is scanned against the most up-to-date database in order to provide the most accurate report possible. The “generating report” window will appear and create a new report for the instructor to view once “View Report” is clicked.


