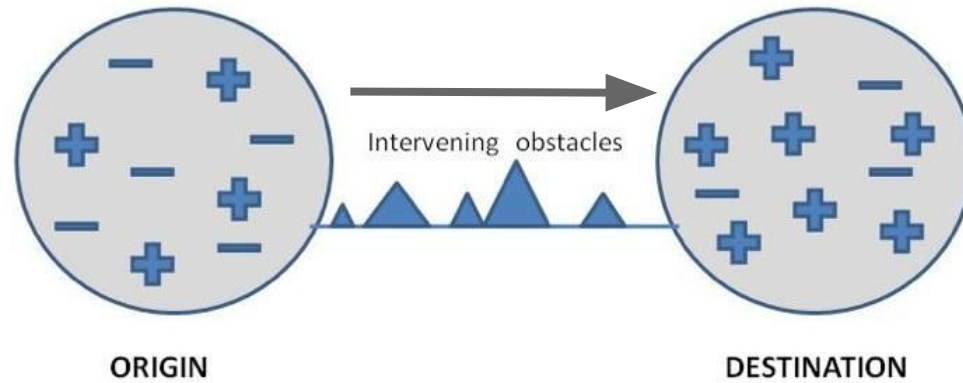


Lee's Migration Model (Push and Pull factors)

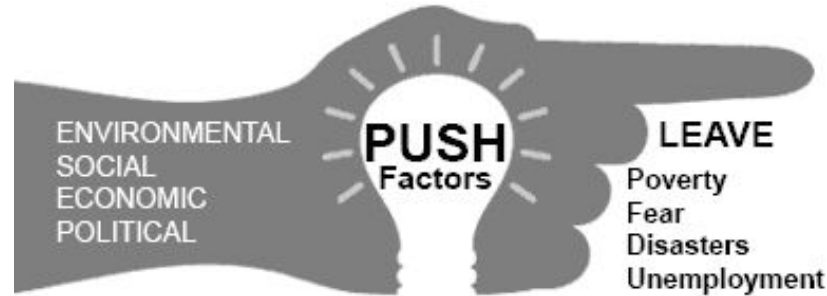
- **Lee's migration model created in 1966 describes the push and pull factors of migration which are basically reasons for emigration and immigration.**
- **A push factor is something that is unfavorable about the area that someone lives in and is a reason for them to leave.**
- **A pull factor is a factor that attracts someone into an area.**
- **The factor could be economic, cultural, or environmental.**

Lee's Push-Pull Theory



This model does not isolate certain push and pull factors, every location has a certain number of attributes of positive, negative and neutral Factors.

**Some examples of push factors
could be war, famine, drought,
and especially low job**



Examples of pull factors are basically better living conditions like job opportunities and better education.
