

Dear 2019-2020 Grade 2, 3, and 4 Families,

Welcome to Grades 2, 3, and 4. Below are the **new** procedures for how iPads will be set up and rolled out. Please note this process is different than in previous years.

iPad Set Up and Roll Out for Grades 2, 3, and 4 Students 2019-2020

Parents have or purchase new, used, or refurbished iPads that meet the minimum requirements (outlined at the bottom of this document).

NOTE *iPads are wiped/reset by the IT department. This means if your child will be using an iPad that has photos, videos, or app/game data you would like to save, you need to back them up. Monday, August 12 First day for new students

Tuesday, August 13 First day for all students

Parents will attend a 1-hour Grades 2, 3, & 4 iPad workshop where IT will:

Friday, August 23

- Collect parent-owned iPads
 - iPads will be wiped of any old data and set up with all of the free school apps organized into folders
- Explain the new iPad folder structure
- Explain iPad settings and which settings students need to have for school
- Help set up Apple IDs for new Apple users
- Help parents download paid apps needed for school
- Answer question parents may have

Between August 23 and September 5

IT department will wipe/reset all iPads and load all of the free apps they need for school. We will also set up a folder structure for the apps to keep them organized.

Between August 23 and September 20

Students complete a **Digital Citizenship Passport** as they continue to learn how to use their iPads safely, respectfully, and in a way that is helpful to their learning.

Friday, September 20

Students and parents are sent the digital **Family Technology Agreement**. This agreement is a document that will support students and their parents in discussing and making decisions about how iPads can be used at home. Parents can look at the Digital Citizenship Passport students have been working on in Seesaw to help guide the conversation.

Monday, September 23

Students sign their Family Technology Agreement. This needs to be completed before students may continue to take their iPads home.
