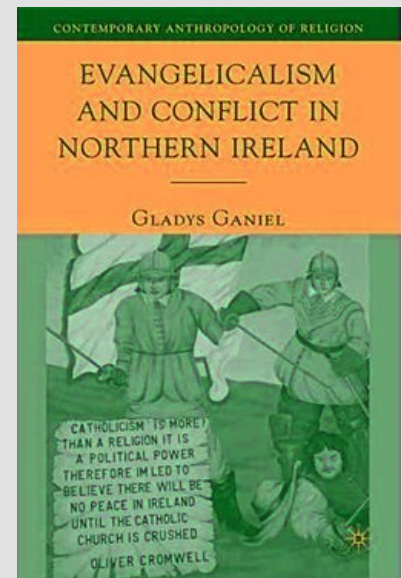
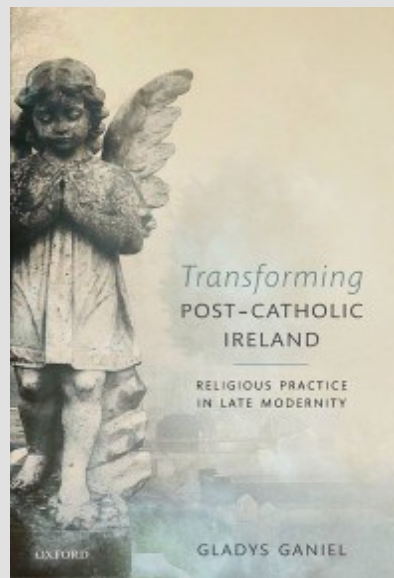
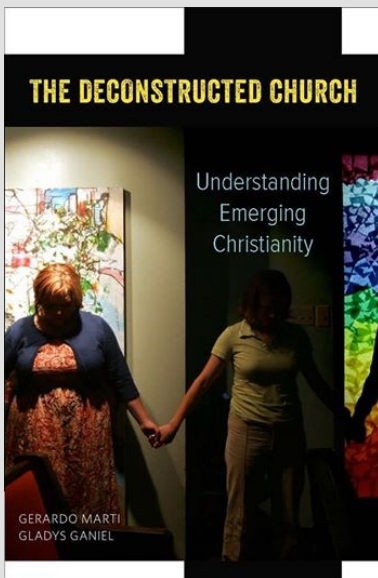

Dr. Gladys Ganiel (PC Class of 1999) is Research Fellow in the Senator George J Mitchell Institute for Global Peace, Security and Justice at Queen's University Belfast. She specializes on religion in Ireland and has authored/co-authored four books and more than 30 articles/ chapters, including *Transforming Post-Catholic Ireland* (Oxford University Press 2016), *The Deconstructed Church: Understanding Emerging Christianity* (co-authored with Gerardo Marti, Oxford University Press 2014), and *Evangelicalism and Conflict in Northern Ireland* (Palgrave 2008). Her current research includes an Irish Department of Foreign Affairs-funded project on how Presbyterians responded to the Troubles in Northern Ireland; and the biography of Fr Gerry Reynolds, a peacemaking priest from Clonard Monastery in Belfast.
