NOTE: Bristol students who complete the A.S. in General Studies (Health & Life Sciences Studies) with at least 60 credits and a minimum GPA of 2.0 are guaranteed admission into the SCE B.A. in Healthcare Administration. Students must earn a grade of “C” or better to earn transfer credit for each course.

1. Providence College SCE will waive the \$55 application fee for students who meet the above requirements.
2. Students must fulfill the Providence College SCE core curriculum requirements; complete the residency requirement of a minimum of 45 credits in Providence College SCE; and earn at least 50% of their major credits with Providence College coursework.
3. Most students transferring in with the Associate’s in General Studies (Health & Life Sciences Studies) will need approximately 60 credits to complete the bachelor’s degree.
4. It is very important to consult with both Bristol and PC SCE advisers regarding courses that can be transferred from Bristol toward free electives at PC SCE.

\*\* The combination of ENG 101 and ENG 102 fulfills the PC SCE Intensive Writing I core requirement.
