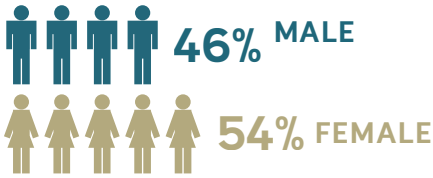

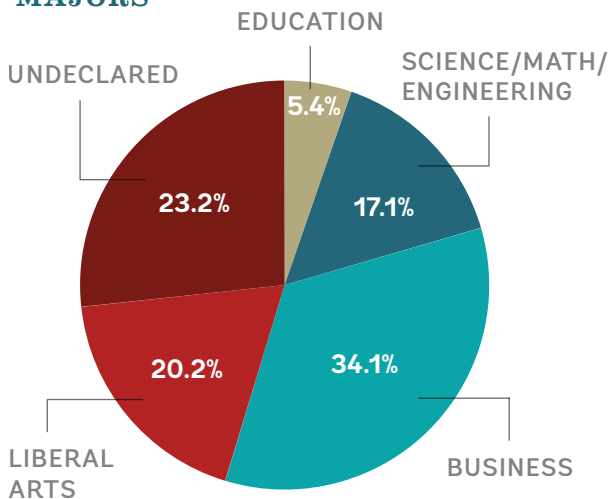

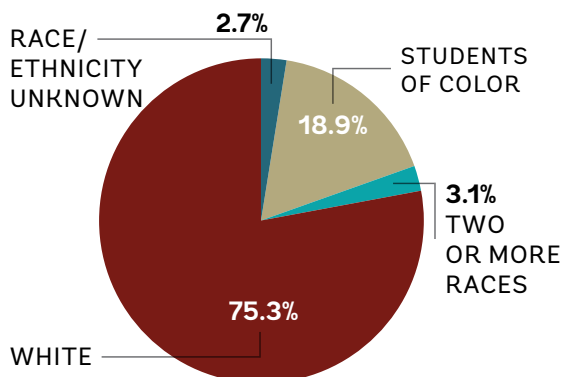
### STANDARDIZED TESTING REPORTING

ACT — **27-30**

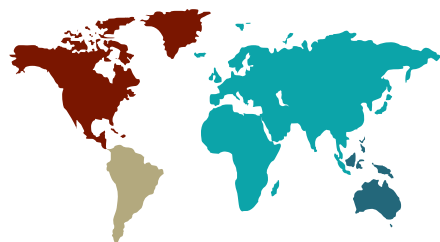
Students who enroll are required to submit test scores so that PC can provide appropriate academic advising.

### ETHNIC PROFILE



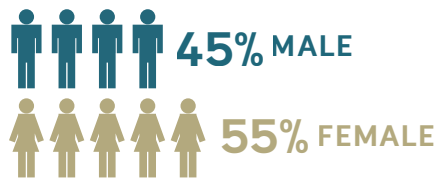

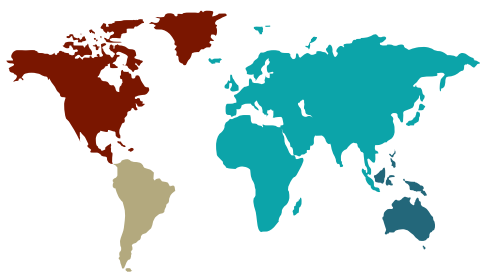

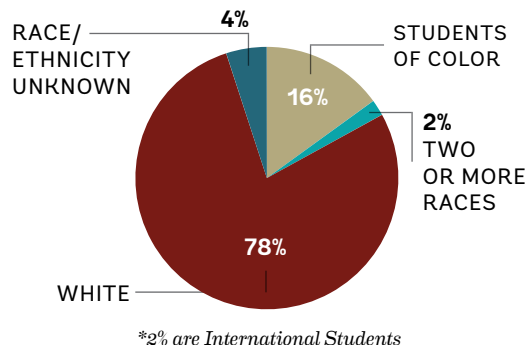


## INTERNSHIPS

Internships are completed in various career fields such as business, healthcare, government, social services, public relations, and more during the fall, spring, and summer.

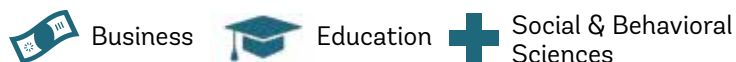

**9%** were working in education

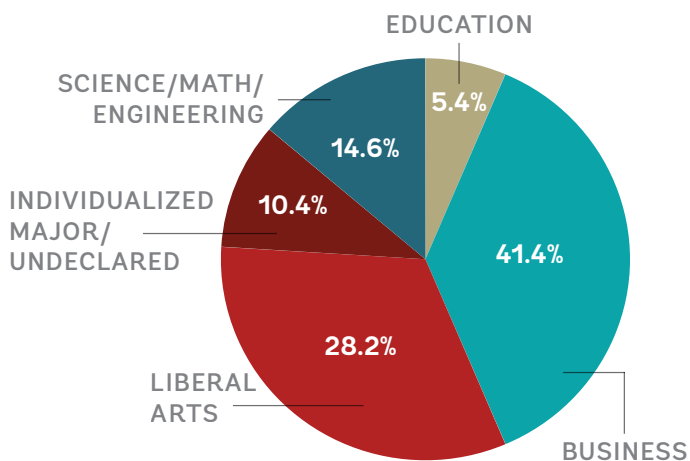
**52%** were working in business fields (accounting, financial services, insurance, marketing, advertising, or retail)

## Student-Faculty Research

**37%** of recent graduates worked with a faculty member on a research project.

In 2018-2019, **99 students** received **funding** from the College to present their research at conferences.



In 2019, **194 students** from **39 majors** presented **120 projects** at the Annual Celebration of Student Scholarship and Creativity.

During the 2018-2019 academic year, **56 students** received more than **\$78,000** in College-sponsored research grants.
