COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER



Faheemah Mustafaa

Assistant Professor, University of California, Davis

Dr. Faheemah Mustafaa is an assistant professor of education in Learning and Mind Sciences at the University of California, Davis. She is also a member of the university's Human Development Graduate Group and a faculty research affiliate with the Center for Poverty & Inequality Research. Dr. Mustafaa primarily conducts interdisciplinary research on in-and out-of-school interventions that support the holistic development and well-being of African American students and students from other historically marginalized groups in the United States. She is currently co-principal investigator of a multi-year National Science Foundation-sponsored project which aims to increase Black girls' and women's representation in STEM. She also studies social justice praxis in postsecondary teaching and learning, and K-12 educators' racial attitudes and practice.

Dr. Mustafaa is driven by a passion for teaching and supporting other people's life journeys. Prior to joining the faculty at University of California, Davis, she was a postdoctoral researcher in Social-Personality Psychology at University of California, Berkeley, and in Teaching and Learning at Vanderbilt University's Peabody College of Education and Human Development. Dr. Mustafaa earned a Ph.D. in the Combined Program in Education and Psychology, and M.A. in Higher Education, both from the University of Michigan. Earlier in her career, she was a middle school science teacher in Miami, Florida and still enjoys collaborating with early adolescents to help them imagine and pursue paths toward their highest potential. In her spare time, she enjoys domestic and international travel, hiking, crafting, and spending quality time with loved ones.

A proud Philadelphia native and first-generation college graduate, Dr. Mustafaa earned a bachelor's degree in Biobehavioral Health from Penn State in 2005, along with a minor in Psychology. Among several campus engagements, she was a Bunton Waller fellow, Penn State Crew rower, and member of the College of Health and Human Development's first cohort of the Women's Leadership Initiative. In 2005, she received the Multicultural Resource Center's Senior Volunteer Service Award for significantly contributing to campus and community service initiatives. She credits faculty members in the College of Health and Human Development for first helping her to understand that studying structural connections between quality education access and health outcomes is an important and worthwhile career endeavor.

Athletic Training

Nancy Williams, B.S., M.A., Sc.D., Professor of Kinesiology and Physiology
Head, Department of Kinesiology

The Athletic Training major in the Department of Kinesiology offers a concentrated curriculum designed to prepare students for a career in an allied health care profession recognized by the American Medical Association. Students in the accredited competency-based program are eligible to sit for the Board of Certification exam and obtain state credentialing as an Athletic Trainer. Graduates practice in a variety of settings using evidence-based interventions aimed at promoting optimal well-being for physically active populations.

Biobehavioral Health

Thomas Gould, B.S., Ph.D., Jean Phillips Shibley Professor of Biobehavioral Health
Head, Department of Biobehavioral Health

Biobehavioral Health is an innovative major that looks at health issues in an integrated way and considers many different factors—biological, social, cultural, and environmental. It offers a strong foundation for students interested in epidemiology, psychology, genetics, neuroscience, public health, human development, health promotion, and human service, and for those interested in conducting biomedical research or attending medical school.

Communication Sciences and Disorders

Communication Sciences and Disorders is a program in which students study the prevention and rehabilitation of speech, language, swallowing, and hearing problems. It has been a national leader for more than seventy-five years. The major draws on linguistics, acoustics, psychology, neuroscience, and anatomy and physiology. Undergraduate students typically go on to graduate study and to gain professional certification and licensure in either Speech-Language Pathology or Audiology or other related areas.

Tasked with coordinating a wide variety of activities that are vital to the delivery of health services and programs, health administrators and policymakers play key roles in addressing the complex societal challenges associated with providing access to quality health care at a reasonable cost. Penn State's Health Policy and Administration department has over 50 years of experience teaching undergraduates about healthcare.

Hospitality Management

The School of Hospitality Management was established in 1937 and is among the oldest and most respected programs of its kind in the nation. Human Development and Family Studies

Human Development and Family Studies prepares students to work in areas such as child care, aging, family services, drug and alcohol rehabilitation, health services, and other human service fields. Graduates also are in demand in human resource management. Many students go on to graduate study. The major has two options: Life Span Human Services and Life Span Developmental Science.

Kinesiology

Head, Department of Kinesiology

Kinesiology offers a comprehensive program in the study of human movement and is designed for students who want to prepare for professions involving physical activity and for graduate study in related areas. The Kinesiology major includes two options at University Park: Applied Exercise and Health and Movement Science. These options provide concentrated programs of study designed to prepare students for careers in teaching, medical specialties, the fitness and wellness industries, and success in graduate and professional schools.

Nutritional Sciences

A. Catharine Ross, B.S., M.N.S., Ph.D.,

Professor of Nutrition and Physiology and Dorothy Foehr Huck Chair

Head, Department of Nutritional Sciences

Nutritional Sciences majors study how the body uses nutrients for growth and development, how needs change throughout life, and how food contributes to health. The Nutrition and Dietetics option incorporates medical nutrition therapy, nutrition education and counseling, culinary principles of nutrition, and business management. It meets the accreditation standards set by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics. The Nutritional Physiology and Biochemistry option incorporates knowledge from biology, chemistry, physiology, and physics with nutrition. The Behavioral Nutrition and Public Health option integrates social and behavioral sciences with human physiology and nutrition to improve the health and well-being of individuals and populations. Graduates work in diverse settings within the food and nutrition field including hospitals, community agencies, sports nutrition, schools, and food and pharmaceutical industries; many of our graduates will complete post-baccalaureate training and education to become a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN). Graduates also go on to medical or dental school, or graduate programs and research.

Recreation, Park, and Tourism Management

Peter Newman, B.A., M.S., Ph.D., Martin Professor of Recreation, Park, and Tourism Management

Head, Department of Recreation, Park, and Tourism Management

The mission of the department of Recreation, Park, and Tourism Management is to engage all people in recreation, park, tourism, and leisure activities to enhance individual and community health and well-being. Our majors study in one of four options; Commercial Recreation leading to careers in sport management, travel/tourism, attractions and resorts; Community Recreation leading to careers in municipal recreation, parks, and non-profit organizations; Outdoor Recreation leading to careers in environmental education, natural and cultural history interpretation, park and outdoor facilities management, and adventure based recreation; and PGA Professional Golf Management leading to careers in the golf industry as PGA professionals.
