Write 4 words or phrases to describe characteristics of the animal you chose (soft/hard, big/small, fast/slow, color, etc.). This helps readers recognize the animal.



Write a story about your animal using the Story Maker page.

Remember from the storyteller's Raven video, all stories have:

- A main character
- A setting
- Beginning, middle, and end events

Look at your drawing and description of your animal. Imagine why the sky is blue or has clouds or contains wind. Tell a story about an how your animal might have been involved. The story should explain why the sky looks the way it does, or is the way it is. Include the main character (your animal); your descriptive words, a setting; and beginning, middle, and end events.
